Summary CV

Anthony is a professional chartered **Landscape Architect** with over 20 years experience, having been elected to the Landscape Institute in January 1988. He is a **Chartered Member of the Landscape Institute**. On leaving the John Leggott College, Scunthorpe, Anthony obtained an **Honours Degree in Town and Country Planning (Grade 2i)** from Leeds Polytechnic in 1982, and then successfully completed a **Masters Degree in Landscape Design** at the University of Sheffield in 1984.

During training he worked voluntarily in the Scunthorpe Borough Council Parks and Recreation Department. On leaving University, Anthony spent five years in local government as an assistant Landscape Architect, firstly with Nottinghamshire County Council and subsequently with Leicestershire County Council, working on a wide range of landscape design and environmental improvement schemes as part of multi-disciplinary teams. This included detailed design of an 18th Century courtyard scheme for the Ryder-Cheshire Mission Hospice (with English Heritage and the National Trust) and responsibility for the landscape agreement for the Asfordby Mine, (with British Coal) to establish and maintain landscape treatment for the new colliery with a budget of £250,000.

Anthony joined DTA in 1989 and has been fully responsible for the Practice's landscape commissions since 1995. He has been the project landscape architect for the majority of the Practice's **landscape design and contract supervision** work for a wide range of project types including mineral, waste, housing, industrial, business park, university, tourism and recreational landscapes. Examples of the wide range of landscape projects for which Anthony has been responsible over the last few years include:

Linghall Quarry, Church Lawford, Warwickshire, sand and gravel quarry with landfill, environmental assessment, landscape design and contract supervision, for Ideal Aggregates plc and Leigh Environmental.

Anthony has considerable experience of **landscape character assessment and landscape evaluation**, for example, Doncaster Borough for the Doncaster MBC (1994); Kinross-shire and Dunfermline areas for SNH (1995), St Andrews area (1996) and then the whole of Fife (1997-98) for SNH and the Fife Council, Rutland County (2003-4), Oadby and Wigston (2004-5) and North Kesteven (2007).

Anthony has worked on the **review of landscape designations** based on a landscape character assessment approach for Doncaster MBC (1994), Nottinghamshire CC (1997 – 2000) and North Kesteven DC (2007) and played a major role in the project developing the methodology for defining the **special qualities of National Scenic Areas** in Scotland, for Scottish Natural Heritage (2006).

Anthony also has extensive experience of **landscape and visual impact assessment for statutory environmental statements and appraisals** for a wide variety of civil engineering projects and other developments including agricultural, industrial, residential, motorist services, water industry, mineral extraction, waste disposal and leisure / recreational uses. He has given evidence as expert witness at public inquiries and appeal hearings.

Anthony has been project **Landscape Architect** and **Environmental Co-ordinator** (co-ordinating the input of other environmental disciplines such as ecology and archaeology) on all of the Practice's **highway schemes**, since joining the Practice in 1989. More recently Anthony has been responsible for delivering the **Environmental Statement** for A453 Widening M1 Junction 24 to A52 Nottingham on behalf of the Highways Agency, their contractor Laing O'Rourke and designer White Young Green.
