## Summary CV

Roslyn is a **Chartered Town Planner** who studied at Wye College (London University) from 1980 to 1983 and obtained an **Honours degree (grade 2ii) in Rural Environment Studies**. Subsequently, she studied at Oxford Polytechnic 1988-1991 to obtain a **Post Graduate Diploma in Urban Planning**. She was elected a **Member of the Royal Town Planning Institute** in 1991. Roslyn also has certificates in **Management Studies** and **Environmental Impact Assessment**.

From 1983 to 1986 Roslyn worked as a Countryside Officer with Surrey's Rural Community Council which involved the organisation of campaigns to help maintain rural services such as village shops, schools and rural buses. It involved the promotion of the Greensand Way Long Distance Footpath. From 1986 to 1988 Roslyn worked for the Oxfordshire Rural Community Council as Rural Transport Officer setting up community run transport schemes and dealing with the Rural Transport Development Grant. She also established a network of bus users in rural areas.

In 1988 Roslyn joined Wycombe District Council in the post of Planning Officer. She initially spent 3 years in the Development Control section dealing with a wide variety of planning applications in both rural and urban areas. In 1991 Roslyn was seconded to the Policy Unit initially to undertake an environmental improvement study of the River Wye, through High Wycombe, and was responsible for the implementation of the study's recommendations with the Council's Leisure Department. This was followed by work on a number of other environmental improvement schemes and preparation for the Wycombe District Local Plan Inquiry.

From 1994 to 2001 Roslyn worked for the Environment Agency, in the Thames and Anglian Regions. In her first post as Forward Planning Officer she promoted Environment Agency policies in development plans and represented the Agency at a number of Examinations in Public and made written representations to Local Plan Inquiries. She also undertook a number of site-specific studies working with consultants in a project management role. These included a study of the growth of Swindon, a report on the future use of the Upper Heyford Airbase and a study on the Cotswold Water Park. In 1998 Roslyn was appointed Team Leader for Planning Liaison, which combined development planning with planning application response work, ensuring that the team provided timely responses to local authority consultations. In October 2000 Roslyn was seconded to work as Assistant Strategic Planning Officer. She was involved in responding to the Regional Policy Guidance for the South East (RPG9) and in the national reorganisation of the Agency's Planning Service. From 2001 to 2003 Roslyn held the post of Forward Planning Officer in the Agency's Lincoln office, following a family move to Lincolnshire, where she was involved in the promotion of Strategic Flood Risk Assessments and local plan consultations.

From 2003 to 2004 Roslyn worked as mineral planning officer for Lincolnshire County Council dealing with mineral applications and associated Environmental Impact Assessments. She also monitored mineral sites and carried out an annual aggregate survey. The post required the determination of a number of County Council planning applications for school buildings.

Roslyn joined DTA in September 2004 and works on a variety of planning and environmental consultancy commissions, including call-off contracts for statutory agencies. She has worked on research and advisory projects for central and local government, including preparation of Supplementary Planning Guidance for biodiversity for the Brecon Beacons National Park Authority, a review of *Planning Tomorrows Countryside* for the Countryside Agency and promotion of the publication *Environmental Quality in Spatial Planning* for the Countryside Agency, English Heritage, English Nature and the Environment Agency. She has worked for the East of England Environment Forum on the response to the East of England Plan, including the preparation of papers to inform the Examination of the Regional Spatial Strategy.

Roslyn has also worked on a wide range of commissions including the sustainability appraisal / strategic environmental assessment of a number of development plans for local authorities, the preparation of planning and biodiversity conservation guidance for the Environment Agency, the drafting of model policies for biodiversity conservation for Hampshire Biodiversity Forum and research on LDFs in the Thames Basin for Natural England. Roslyn has also contributed to the trialling of a method for identifying the special qualities of Scotland's National Scenic Areas for Scottish Natural Heritage 2005-2006.
